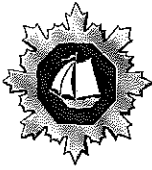

SUBJECT: CORNWALLIS STREET, SYDNEY

DATE: JUNE 22, 2020

During one of the tri-council meetings the issue of having a street named Cornwallis in CBRM was raised and a request to review the possibility of renaming the street was brought forward.

Consequently, I was asked to research the origin of the name Cornwallis Street, in Sydney. I was unable to find any minutes of the Council of the former City of Sydney that discussed the issue. A title review of properties did not reveal anyone in the area with a name Cornwallis owning any land in the area for which a street may be named as is a common practice throughout the Municipality. There are other streets in the vicinity such as Cabot and Cartier which seem to be named after historical figures. Therefore, it is reasonable to assume that Cornwallis Street was named after Governor Edward Cornwallis, the former Governor of Nova Scotia. This is presumptive, anything more definitive would require the services of a historian or the Beaton Institute.

If Council wishes to entertain a street renaming process as result of the request to rename the street, a motion can be made to have the Planning Department initiate the process.
